REQUIREMENTS

- Non-permitted discharge of pollutants to either waters of the U.S. or waters of the state is prohibited:
 - Clean Water Act
 - State Water Control Law
- Discharge permits are only issued for treatment plants.
- SSOs are prohibited. There will be future SSOs.
 Owners/operators of treatment facilities and collection systems must enter into Consent Orders, which will detail the requirements that must be met.
 - EPA National Wet Weather Enforcement Policy





MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT HIGHLIGHTS

Purpose Signatories – Thirteen localities, HRSD, HRPDC Administrative Provisions Process for Modifying Consent Order Compliance with Regional Technical **Standards** Self-policing & Conflict Resolution Notification Outlives Consent Order



HRPDC ROLE IN MOA

HRPDC Directors of Utilities Committee

- Coordinate the multi-jurisdictional work & activities required by the Regional Order
- Organize subcommittees or work groups to accomplish work and resolve issues

HRPDC Staff

- Provide staffing coordination & support for the Directors of Utilities Committee
- Coordinate the notification process
- Select and manage mediators to facilitate dispute resolution



OUTSTANDING ISSUE

- Region believes effective approach requires HRSD & Localities to be governed by same Order at state level.
- DEQ has indicated concurrence with this.
- EPA has referred HRSD to the Department of Justice for enforcement.
 - Resolution of this may impact the Regional Consent Order process.
 - Approval of Consent Order Package and authorization believed helpful to HRSD in resolving this issue.
