

“Zero” Discharge Pollutants

The following list, which may be amended periodically, includes those pollutants that are known or suspected to be bioaccumulative and/or harmful to the environment. There may be no discharge of wastewaters into the sanitary sewer system that contain quantifiable concentrations of these chemicals as determined by EPA/HRSD approved methodologies. This list is available from the HRSD Pretreatment & Pollution Prevention Division office.
