Repair of HRSD Pipeline Completed

–Public Advised to Avoid Recreational Activities in Affected Areas–

HRSD crews have completed an emergency repair of a leaking sanitary sewer force main within the southbound lanes of Kempsville Road near Hunningdon Lakes Boulevard. This work was completed yesterday and the southbound lanes of Kempsville Road were reopened by 3:30 p.m. A temporary pavement patch was placed allowing the road to reopen and the permanent paving restoration will take place in the coming weeks.

The contents of the pipeline that could not be recovered leaked into the stormwater retention ponds in the Greenbrier East Neighborhood and flowed through to the Intracoastal Waterway between Centerville Turnpike and the Great Bridge Locks. As a precaution, residents should avoid swimming and fishing activities, or use of these waters for irrigation, until further notice
