

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE



Holland Road Sanitary Sewer Pipeline Replacement

HRSD, your regional wastewater treatment utility, continues working on a project to construct a new sanitary sewer pipeline. In the downtown Suffolk area replacement of approximately 2,300 linear feet of the city's water main piping and a small section of city sewer is underway.

In a cooperative effort between HRSD, the City of Suffolk and Virginia Natural Gas (VNG), HRSD's contractor has delayed paving efforts until various utility work is completed. This coordination ensures that newly placed asphalt is not disturbed by the additional utility work needed in the same corridor that we are also working in.

The current VNG installation is schedule to continue through the middle of May. HRSD will then return to complete the remaining gravity sewer and manhole rehabilitation work.

The restoration of Katherine Street is estimated to begin in early summer and should last approximately sixty days. This work is weather and situation dependent, please see our website for project updates.

HRSD would like to thank residents for their continued understanding and patience during this important project that fulfills our mission to protect public health and the waterways of Hampton Roads by treating wastewater effectively.
