

CONSTRUCTION NOTICE 2 – July 2016



Holland Road Sanitary Sewer Pipeline Replacement-Phase I -- Around the Clock Work to Begin after Rain Delay --

HRSD, your regional wastewater treatment utility, continues a project to construct a new sanitary sewer pipeline to replace the existing pipeline built in the 1970s. HRSD is also working with the City of Suffolk to replace approximately 3,300 linear feet of water main piping in the Oak Ridge Subdivision as a part of this project. This work is to primarily take place between the hours of 7 a.m. – 4 p.m., Monday through Friday.

The contractor has been delayed due to extensive rain water in the pits excavated for the equipment. When the pits dry, they will begin the trenchless underground insertion of a 300 foot section of steel casing to house the new HRSD sewer pipe near Lakewood Drive. Once this work starts it must run continue (including overnight) until completed. This work schedule is weather and situation dependent. We regret any inconvenience this work might cause.

While our contractor and project team work diligently to minimize impacts, you may notice some noise, additional lighting required for safety during night work, dust and increased heavy equipment traffic (with back-up safety alarms) associated with construction. Please take care when traveling around the construction area and for your safety, do not enter the site. Thank you for your support of this effort to help achieve HRSD's vision: *Future generations will inherit clean waterways and be able to keep them clean.*
