

Thank you for your interest in the Woodstock Park Improvement Project! We appreciate you taking the time to express your ideas with us as we work closely with Team Pain to deliver an incredible new skate facility for the wheeled-sports community to enjoy.

Submit Final Input and Sketches by December 20

Due to increased interest and enthusiasm for this project and the tremendous feedback we've received, we've extended the deadline for additional input and added an option to submit your design sketches for consideration. Here's how:

- **Download Woodstock Skate Park layouts** to use as your blank canvas to sketch your design ideas.
- Click below to upload your sketches and submit your feedback **by Friday**, **December 20**.
- Review key points below to keep in mind when sharing your feedback.

Key Points for Consideration

- Areas depicted in the layouts have been illustrated larger than the ultimate 20,000 square feet planned for ease of use in providing any feedback via hand sketches that may not be to scale.
- While lighting around the skate park was expressly desired at the initial public input meeting, this amenity should not be a primary focus in feedback or sketches. At this time, our focus is on delivering the largest amount of skateable area and lighting upgrades will be considered once the park is open and funding becomes available.
- Consider and include other desired amenities such as seating areas, shade structures, and observation areas that will not be skateable
- Assume that there will be green spaces and non-riding areas for the spectators and non-users in and around the skate park that are not shown on the layouts
- Note that on top of the tank roof structure can only be built up and may have some other limitations. (i.e. we cannot put a bowl on the roof area.)
- Roof and two levels below can be any shape, size, and combination of elevations that add up to 20,000 square feet
- Adding a bowl on the bottom level (height = 0 ft) cannot be accommodated. Bowls depth at the mid-level (height = 4 ft) can only be 6 ft deep and bowl depth at top level (height = 7 ft) can only be 9 ft deep.

Next Steps

Team Pain will evaluate the feedback and develop a design concept in the coming months. Stay tuned for an announcement via email and <u>Facebook</u> regarding a public input meeting this winter where we'll present those concepts and discuss how your feedback and other factors played a role in the elements that were chosen.
