

York River Treatment Plant Outfall Project CONSTRUCTION UPDATE October 7, 2016



Contractor to Begin Pile Installation in York River —Boaters should use caution near work area—

HRSD, your regional wastewater treatment utility, is constructing a new outfall and diffuser so we can continue to provide wastewater treatment services to communities served by our York River Treatment Plant. **Our contractor**, whose schedule is weather dependent, typically works Monday through Friday between the hours of 7:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. but **may begin Saturday work** if needed to meet a critical February deadline. Completion is expected by May 2017.

Most of the work to be performed on land has been completed. The marine phase of the project, which included construction of an oyster reef, is underway. **The contractor will begin inserting piles into the river bottom in mid-October. These pile supports are required to ensure the outfall pipe's stability and allow its proper function.** If on the water, you may see pipe floating on the river before it is placed on top of the piles inserted along the river bottom. **For your safety, we ask you to take care when near the construction site and floating pipe.**

While our contractor and project team work diligently to minimize impacts, boaters may hear the heavy equipment noise associated with construction and see the lights required for safety.
